

1. Zamboanga Peninsula

Inflation rates in Zamboanga Peninsula continued to decelerate at 6.4 percent in April 2023, from 9.0 percent in March 2023. Inflation in April 2022 was lower at 4.5 percent. (Table A and Figure 1)

The primary driver in the region's inflation downward trend was the lower increase in the indices of *Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages* at 7.4 percent from 10.8 percent in the previous month and *Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels* at 5.2 percent from 7.8 percent in the previous month.

Also contributing to the overall inflation in Zamboanga Peninsula during the period were the downtrend in the indices of the following commodity groups as compared with their previous month's inflation rates:

- 1) Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, 7.8 percent from 8.1 percent;
- 2) Clothing and footwear, 3.2 percent from 3.3 percent;
- 3) Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance,4.5 percent from 5.2 percent;
- 4) Transport, 3.0 percent from 5.6 percent;
- 5) Information and communication, 0.8 percent from 1.0 percent;

- 6) Recreation, sport and culture, 3.8 percent from 4.4 percent;
- 7) Restaurants and accommodation services, 13.3 percent from 16.2 percent; and
- 8) Personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services, 4.4 percent from 4.9 percent.

Meanwhile, annual inflation accelerated in the index of *Health* at 4.1 percent during this month from 3.9 percent in the previous month.

The rest of the commodity groups retained their previous month's inflation rates.

Likewise, food index slowed down to 7.6 percent in April 2023 from 11.4 percent in March 2023. In April 2022, food inflation was recorded at 3.1 percent.

The following food groups recorded to have lower increments:

- a) Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals, 6.3 percent from 8.2 percent;
- b) Fish and other seafood, 2.1 percent from 14.5 percent;
- c) Oils and fats, 15.0 percent from 16.5 percent;
- d) Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses, 13.3 percent from 23.4 percent;
- e) Sugar, confectionery and desserts, 31.6 percent from 33.8 percent; and
- f) Ready-made food and other food products n.e.c., 8.2 percent from 8.4 percent.

On the other hand, the following food groups were observed to have higher increments:

- a) Cereals and cereal products, 6.1 percent from 6.0 percent;
- b) Milk, other dairy products and eggs; 8.6 percent from 7.7 percent; and
- c) Fruits and nuts, 19.2 percent from 18.3 percent.

Among the provinces in the region, Zamboanga del Sur had the highest inflation at 8.1 percent, followed by City of Isabela at 7.6 percent, Zamboanga Sibugay at 6.7 percent, Zamboanga del Norte at 6.4 percent, and City of Zamboanga at 4.8 percent.
