

## 1. Zamboanga Peninsula

Inflation rates in Zamboanga Peninsula continued to slow down at 5.9 percent in May 2023, from 6.4 percent in April 2023. Inflation in May 2022 was lower at 5.6 percent. (Table A and Figure 1)

The slowdown in the region's inflation was mainly due to the slower increase in the indices of *Restaurants and Accommodation Services* at 10.2 percent from 13.3 percent in the previous month and *Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels* at 5.0 percent from 5.2 percent in the previous month.

Also contributing to the overall inflation in Zamboanga Peninsula during the period were the downtrend in the indices of the following commodity groups as compared with their previous month's inflation rates:

- 1) Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, 7.2 percent from 7.8 percent;
- 2) Clothing and footwear, 3.1 percent from 3.2 percent;
- Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance,
   4.3 percent from 4.5 percent;
- 4) Transport, -0.7 percent from 3.0 percent; and
- Personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services, 4.3 percent from 4.4 percent.

Meanwhile, annual inflation accelerated in the indices of the following commodity groups;

- 1) Food and Non-alcoholic beverages, 7.5 percent from 7.4 percent;
- 2) Information and communication, 1.0 percent from 0.8 percent; and
- 3) Recreation, sport and culture, 4.3 percent from 3.8 percent.

The rest of the commodity groups retained their previous month's inflation rates.

Likewise, food index slowed down to 7.5 percent in May 2023 from 7.6 percent in April 2023. In May 2022, food inflation was recorded at 4.7 percent.

The following food groups recorded to have lower increments:

- a) Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals, 5.7 percent from
   6.3 percent,
- b) Oils and fats, 12.7 percent from 15.0 percent;
- c) Fruits and nuts, 16.9 percent from 19.2 percent; and
- d) Sugar, confectionery and desserts, 29.7 percent from 31.6 percent.

On the other hand, the following food groups were observed to have higher increments:

- a) Cereals and cereal products, 6.3 percent from 6.1 percent;
- b) Fish and other seafood, 2.3 percent from 2.1 percent;
- c) Milk, other dairy products and eggs; 9.9 percent from 8.6 percent; and
- d) Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses, 14.2 percent from 13.3 percent.

Inflation in the index of Ready-made food and other food products n.e.c. have retained their previous months inflation at 8.2 percent.

Among the provinces in the region, City of Isabela had the highest inflation at 7.9 percent, followed by Zamboanga del Sur at 7.0 percent, Zamboanga del Norte at 6.5 percent, Zamboanga Sibugay at 6.1 percent, and City of Zamboanga at 4.2 percent.
